Discussion	Kate Kilgarriff presented the Fundraising Report.
Parent Social scheduled for March at the Berwyn Tavern. For the first time, the PTO has an app for parents to bid on the items donated. The auction will be open for two weeks prior to the event. An email will be sent to all families with instructions on how to register for the app. A handful of items may only be available for bidding at the event. Raffle basket donations total \$1,800.00 so far. Vice President of Social Functions**Jessica Littleton**

Discussion	Jessica Littleton presented the Social Functions Report.

Vice President of Membership & Services**Laura Mills**

Discussion	Laura Mills presented the Membership & Services Report.
Staff breakfast Friday the 10 th at 7:30 A.M. Purchasing a hat for the crossing guard. Photo requests made for the yearbook, especially 4 th grade. Send all photos to Carolyn Noll. The district has a new policy that staff cannot tutor students outside of school for extra pay. Open positions are mostly clubs because parents aren't sure what events they will be signing children up for next year.	

T+E Care presentation

Discussion	Sandi Gorman from T+E Care presented a summary and pamphlet of the services provided by T+E Care. Have provided approximately \$215k in assistance in prior year. College assistance, school supplies and guidance. Clothing drive is their annual fundraiser. March 15-24 collecting donations at Hillside and both the Tredyffrin and Easttown Libraries. They don't sell the clothes, only accept donation in whatever amount people can give. Suggested donation is \$10/bag. Everyone is encouraged to shop for a good cause. Hosted at St Matthews Church on Walker Rd. on March 31-April 1. They are looking for a chairperson for their annual fundraiser, Fall Fest Dinner Gala. The committees are already in place and ready to go.
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Old Business

Discussion	PAL boards were sold at the school store last year. Laura Mills will ask Jenn Bachman if they are planning to sell them this year. Nicole Scherer will follow up with Michelle Barton to see who she ordered from last year and what the turnaround time is. At the last PTO meeting, Tracy Johnson was concerned about meeting the budget if we discontinued the Fun Run. Kathy Gribb informed that the following fundraisers were eliminated this year: 5K Walk (\$2,355.25), Target Card (\$2,482.77), Library Card (\$42.00) and Whole Foods (\$1,119.81) totaling \$6,000.
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New Business

Discussion	<p>Laura Mills commented that there never seems to be enough spots in the parking lot. She felt bad for the staff on days when parents are visiting. Mrs. Cohle stated that the district is aware of the issue and is sending someone to look into the problem and measure the parking lot.</p> <p>Tracy Johnson asked the Boards opinion on what community events should be included in the weekly emails. Currently only not for profit items have been included. Some of the elementary schools don't include any community information. Mrs. Cohle stated that the district used to be stricter on including community items, however, now it is up to the individual PTOs discretion. Tracy will as the Communications team for their thoughts and will bring it up again at the next PTO meeting.</p> <p>Nicole Scherer informed the Board that the possibility of the Township abolishing the Property Tax was a serious issue and could very likely pass when they vote. If this happens, there would be a straight 7% tax on all sales. The Township is stating the schools will still receive the same amount of funding as they currently do. Anyone concerned is encouraged to contact our local representative, Warren Kampf to express their thoughts.</p>
